Child Development Curriculum Overview 2024 Onwards

The aim of the Child Development curriculum at Penketh High school is to give students an opportunity to create a solid foundation of knowledge and skills which will enable them to progress beyond KS4 into further education at level 3 and beyond. Students will acquire sector-specific applied knowledge through vocational contexts by studying children's growth and development, learning through play, and supporting children to play, learn and develop, as part of their KS4 learning. We aim to broaden learners' experiences and understanding of the world through case studies and scenarios.

The Level 2 course is designed to inspire and engage students by providing a broad and coherent curriculum which develops an understanding of the child development sector, including the professionals who work with families and children and the ways they help young children develop. Students will be able to use the vocabulary of a professional with confident. They will develop transferable creative and critical thinking skills by learning to apply their knowledge to real-life case studies.
